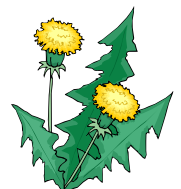

Middle & Senior High School, Young Adult and Outreach Experiences

August 4 — 10 Off to the north... 20 of us working in community to help our neighbors. We will live at St. Charles, Burlington and spend our week with food bank, clothing bank, in migrant farm camps, celebrating Mass, visiting San Juan Rehab and Care elders, and more. Making a difference, learning and caring.

Confirmation 2014 sign ups will begin in September. Must be 16 by May, 2014, a regular Mass and youth group attendee or otherwise committed in our parish. Stay tuned.

Ghana 2013 trekkers are home. We visited 3 villages, a Catholic orphanage* for differently abled kids, worked at the food bank in Wiaga <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=2KdDjiPYuQQ&hd=1>, built a water catchment system at Childcare Foundation, painted, and otherwise had a most wondrous experience. *Sister Stan is from the town of Bawku, in Northern Ghana, where she was raised with three brothers and four sisters. At 10 years of age, she began spending as much time as her family would allow with the nuns near her village, and she entered the convent in 1994. She has worked now as a missionary in West Africa for over 16 years. Sister Stan's faithful service has earned her the esteem and blessing of the Yendi Catholic Diocese to reach out in a very powerful way in her home country of Ghana. A diabolical practice that exists locally is to ritually kill children who are born with any physical deformity, disability, or even an anomaly (such as twins). Sister Stan describes her response to this evil: "We give ourselves to God for the service of persons who are poor. We meet the needs of our dehumanized brothers and sisters, the most abandoned, the marginalized, and those cut off from the sunlight of human companionship in our large human family. We are called to the vocation of love." Water Access Now is funding a borehole at the site of the new orphanage but it seems there is not water under ground. A local holy man, Moses by name, has used his divining rod and found a spot where he is sure there is water. We are drilling one more time... and extended our hands and prayed for the miracle of water in Sang. You pray, too!

Events around our Parish

The parish offices have been cleaned, carpeted, and painted. The parking lot has been re-sealed and striped. Top soil has been placed in the gravel area near the flag pole of the parish and grass will be planted there. Our clean up crew, cleaned up the church and chapel beautifully. The rectory fence has been stained... so many things are getting done this summer. We are so blessed. Thanks for making this parish so beautiful!
