You can check the website for the diocese you will be visiting. Many have lists of Mass times by location. But my go-to website for finding a Mass time is MassTimes.org. You just type the zip code you will be visiting in the box at the top, press enter, and it does the rest. You get a list of churches closest to that zip code, along with their scheduled Mass times.

One note of caution. Parishes do occasionally alter there schedules, so I usually visit the parish web site to verify the time.

So there is really no reason not to go to Mass when away from home. Sometimes we have to drive 30 minutes or so, but isn't it worth it? It tells our children that worshipping God is a top priority in our lives.

God doesn't take a vacation from us, so why should we take a vacation from God?

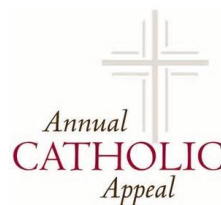
