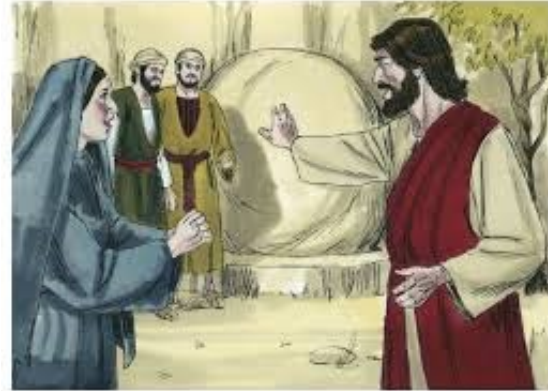

Facilities Work Bench: Elevator is almost done! We are waiting for final inspections, a blessing and dedication and then it will be ready to ride. The roof leaks over the Sanctuary are still being looked into. We are looking at some alternative options for the Steeple to prevent current and future issues in that area. Did you notice the north gravel parking area? No more potholes and washout areas. The whole area was reworked, sloped and new gravel added. Should be good for years to come! The Kitchen is in the midst of major overhaul. Counter tops were already redone with full stainless tops to promote a sanitary food preparation environment and the floor is being re-coated with a durable epoxy finish. Not expecting it, but not totally surprised either, we had to replace the floor substrate but that means a very solid floor system that also will be good for many years. We are replacing a couple of the appliances that have outlived their useful life - one refrigerator and a double door freezer, both commercial grade. The other appliances are being cleaned before re-positioning.
