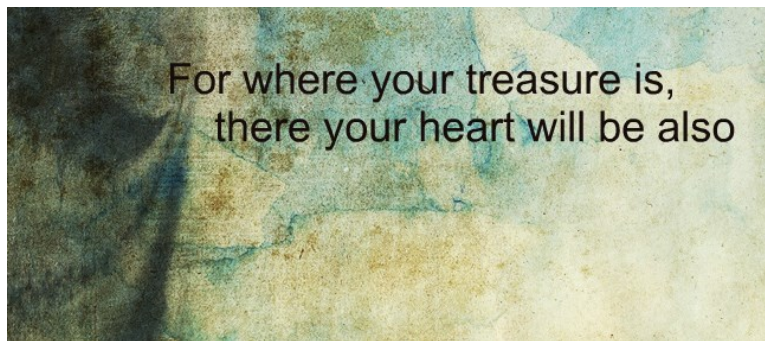

Sacramental Preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion will begin in September 2016. Please keep looking at the bulletin and parish website for more details.

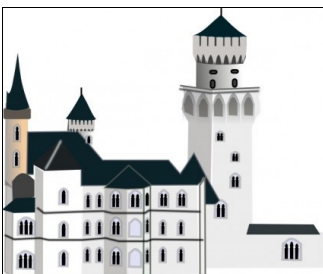

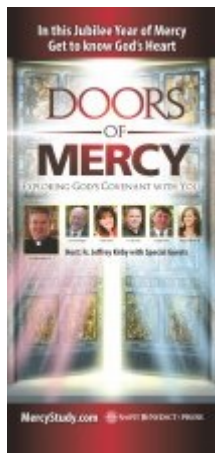
