

Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

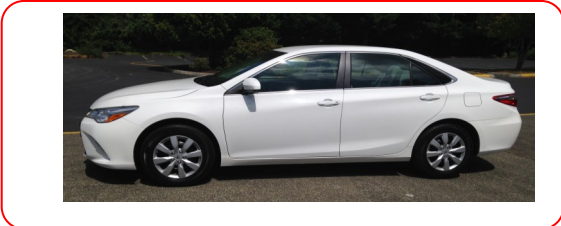
Dear Parishioners,

Composting! You will notice new compost containers in the preschool, the kitchen, and by the coffee containers. Please place food scraps including, fruit and vegetable scraps and leftover, egg shells, beans, dairy products, bread, pasta grains, donuts, meat, chicken, fish and seafood leftovers along with food soiled papers including coffee grounds and filters, teabags, nap-



kins, paper towels, paper bags, newspaper, shredded paper, greasy pizza boxes, paper egg cartons, berry cartons, waxed cardboard, non-shiny uncoated) paper plates. Cedar grove-approved compostable containers and tableware. There is a small dumpster with a compostable liner out back where the big dumpsters are located. This is a free service provided by the city of Kirkland for businesses.

Let's Repair God's House Roof Update: The skylight window should be replaced by the first week of October. It was scheduled to have been done in August but was delayed by the manufacturer. The total pledges for the roof so far are \$258,559.00 of which \$114,188 has been received. The goal for the campaign to repair the roof & replace the skylights is \$330,000. 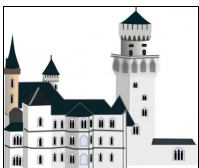

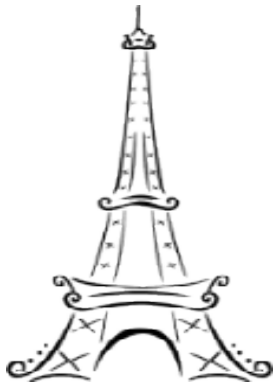
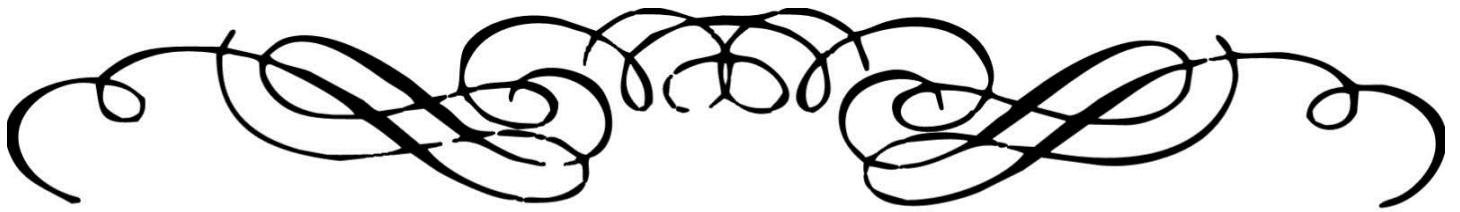
