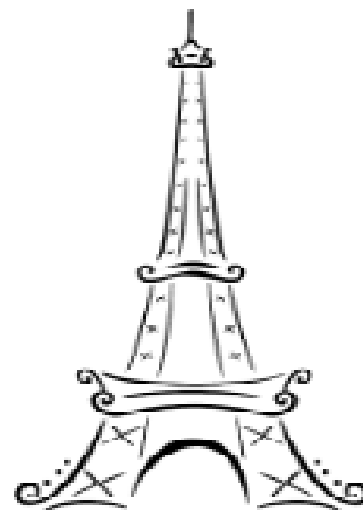
Dear Parishioners,

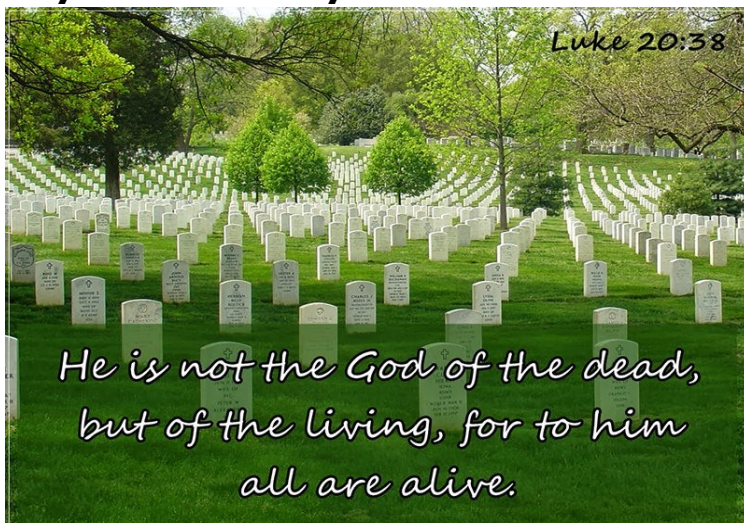
